# Collaboration and exploration lead to breakthroughs.

We built the new research facility at AGH to further our pursuit of making cancer a treatable disease rather than a terminal one.

Some cancers are so tricky and aggressive that it takes teams of experts to unravel their complexities. Our physicians and scientists explore avenues of discovery to find cancer earlier, treat it effectively, and give patients the best possible quality of life after their cancer journey.



### Game-changing discoveries and therapies happen here.

### GammaPod®

With one of the world's first GammaPod® systems, we will be able to deliver precise, high doses of radiation to breast tumors. The strength and accuracy means patients only need one to five treatment days, instead of the standard six weeks.

### **Elekta Unity MR-Linac**

Only a few health facilities in the country have the Elekta Unity MR-Linac, and AGH will be one of them. It produces MRIs of a tumor during the radiation delivery, so doctors can match the shape, size, and position of the tumor.

### Genomics and Precision Medicine Center

Genetic experts at our new center break down patients' genes to figure out which ones are driving tumor growth. Knowing this information lets us choose which drug or therapy has the best chance of eliminating the cancer cells.

### **HIPEC**

Abdominal cancers are among the most challenging, but a procedure called hyperthermic intraperitoneal chemotherapy (HIPEC) provides some patients with promising outcomes. Pioneers in performing this highly complex surgery, our surgeons remove all visible tumors from the abdomen and then circulate a heated chemotherapy solution in the abdomen to kill any cancer cells left behind.

### Gamma Knife®

This technology helps us treat some of the most difficult brain tumors, like the ones nestled in areas close to critical brain functions. Instead of surgery, we aim 200 beams of radiation directly at the tumor. Gamma Knife® involves no incision and no pain, and can stop the growth of certain brain tumors and even completely eliminate them.

### Advanced treatments and high-quality care.

### Innovative surgeries

Our highly experienced AHN surgeons perform procedures to prevent, diagnose, and treat cancer. For some cancers, we use robotics and other specialized techniques so the impact to the body is as minimal as possible. That often means small scars or none at all, less pain, and a pretty quick return to daily routines.

### Radiation therapy

We have advanced technology to deliver highly precise radiation directly to tumors, minimizing harm to surrounding healthy tissue and organs. AHN radiation oncologists have been at the forefront of putting leading-edge technologies and techniques in radiation therapy into clinical practice.

### Chemotherapy

Our medical oncologists determine the most effective type of medical treatments to kill cancer cells, control their growth, or relieve pain symptoms. We use chemotherapy in combination with other treatments to either shrink tumors before surgery or radiation or to eliminate all cancer cells after other treatments have been performed.

### Immunotherapy and targeted therapy

We use different types of immunotherapy to stimulate a patient's immune system to fight cancer cells. And we use targeted therapy to direct drugs directly to the abnormal parts of the cell that create the disease.

### Clinical trials and research

We discover new and better cancer treatments through clinical trials. A patient's treatment may include one of these cutting-edge treatments.

### Advanced imaging and diagnostics

Developments in imaging technology allows us to detect tumors early for more positive outcomes, including cures. We have several diagnostic methods — from mammograms and tomosynthesis to MRIs and PET scans to bone scans and endoscopy.



### An expert team built around each patient.

Life changes suddenly for people who are told they have cancer. But after the shock wears off, patients want help getting the most effective treatment from experts in their cancer.

The AHN Cancer Institute at Allegheny General has oncologists who tailor treatment plans for each patient. Our teams provide comprehensive care, bringing together surgical, medical, and radiation oncologists, radiologists, pathologists, oncology nurses, mental health specialists, nutritionists, rehabilitation specialists, genetic counselors, pharmacists, and social workers.

And with starting care quickly being so crucial to outcomes, our cancer team typically meets patients within three days of diagnosis to discuss next steps.



### Specialists for every type of cancer.

Our patients also have the added expertise of a larger team of AHN physicians known as "tumor boards," each having deep expertise in a cancer specialization. These clinicians discuss and determine the right combination of treatments, even therapies that target cancers based on a patient's genetic profile.

Through video conferencing, these meetings include doctors at all of our AHN Cancer Institute locations. We do this so every patient has the same group expertise, no matter where they go for their doctor visits and treatments.





## Supporting patients' physical and emotional needs.

Cancer care goes well beyond treating the disease. We focus on patients' total health before, during, and after their treatments, so they always have a support team in place.

These are some of AHN's offerings for oncology patients' unique needs.

### One nurse to guide each patient

Patients have their own nurse navigator from beginning to end of their cancer journey for comprehensive guidance and support.

### Testing genes for hereditary cancer

If a patient has a type of cancer that poses an inherited cancer risk, we have genetic counselors who provide testing and management options.

### Rehabilitating the body

Specially trained AHN oncology physical therapists can help minimize side effects and maximize a patient's quality of life.

### Keeping the heart strong

Patients who may be at risk for heart troubles because of their treatments can receive care from our cardio-oncology specialists.

### Holistic approach to treatment

Patients can have complementary therapies like meditation, massage therapy, yoga, and acupuncture.

### Strengthening mental health

We have psychiatrists, social workers, and support groups to help patients with their mental well-being.
