The AHN Cancer Institute at Saint Vincent Hospital in Erie has oncologists who tailor treatment plans for each patient. And with starting care quickly being so crucial to outcomes, our cancer team typically meets patients within three days of diagnosis to discuss next steps.

Most patients can receive all of their treatments right at the Erie location, including some of the latest therapies and innovations. And if patients have more challenging cancers, they have direct access to additional AHN oncology experts who specialize in specific types of the disease.



The state-of-the-art facility has advanced technologies and therapies that target patients' cancers for the best possible outcomes.

And it's all in comfortable, peaceful surroundings where the staff comes to know and support each patient and their family.

The new, two-story, 38,000-squarefoot institute, located adjacent to the hospital, is designed to make patients' experiences as welcoming, calming, and healing as possible. That includes spacious treatment areas with an abundance of natural light, and plenty of room for patients' loved ones to remain onsite for support.



Advanced treatments and high-quality care.

Surgery

Our highly experienced AHN surgeons perform procedures to prevent, diagnose, and treat cancer. For some cancers, we use robotics and other specialized techniques so the impact to the body is as minimal as possible. That often means small scars or none at all, less pain, and a pretty quick return to daily routines. Surgeons are included on a patient's care team when the need arises.

Chemotherapy

Our medical oncologists determine the most effective type of medical treatments to kill cancer cells, control their growth, or relieve pain symptoms. We use chemotherapy in combination with other treatments to either shrink tumors before surgery or radiation or to eliminate all cancer cells after other treatments have been performed.

Immunotherapy and targeted therapy

Our doctors treat some patients with immunotherapy, which boosts their immune systems to fight cancer cells. And we treat others by targeting cancer-eliminating drugs directly to the abnormal parts of the cell that create the disease.

Radiation therapy

We have advanced technology to deliver highly precise radiation directly to tumors, minimizing harm to surrounding healthy tissue and organs. Our technologies include respiratory motion management to continually locate a tumor, even as it moves when a patient breathes. This helps us direct radiation to the tumor and away from the heart and lungs, which is particularly helpful when treating breast cancer.

We also offer stereotactic body radiation therapy (SBRT), which administers very high doses of pinpoint-accurate radiation without an incision. The surgical precision of SBRT is useful in treating small and difficult-to-reach tumors in the brain and spine and can significantly reduce the number of treatments a patient needs.

Clinical trials

We discover new and better cancer treatments through clinical trials. A patient's care plan may include one of these cutting-edge treatments.

Specialists for every type of cancer.

No one fights cancer alone. Not patients. And not us.

Each patient at the AHN Cancer Institute at Saint Vincent has a comprehensive care team, working together to ensure the best possible outcome.

And they also have the extra backing of a larger team of physicians known as tumor boards, each having deep expertise in cancer specialization.

These clinicians discuss and determine the right combination of treatments, even therapies that target cancers based on a patient's genetic profile.

Through video conferencing, these meetings include doctors at all of our AHN Cancer Institute locations, including Saint Vincent Hospital. We do this so every patient has the same group expertise, no matter where they go for their doctor visits and treatments.

Collaboration with Johns Hopkins Medicine

When faced with recurring cancers that are among the most complex to treat, we collaborate with our colleagues at Johns Hopkins Sidney Kimmel Cancer Center in Baltimore, Maryland. We join forces on research and clinical trials and have peer-topeer consultations.

Like you, we're motivated by helping patients.

So when we're exploring and discovering new ways to diagnose and treat cancer, we think big and creatively. Our doctors and scientists work together to come up with novel ideas and approaches. And when one looks promising, we have to test it, evaluate it, and test it again. It can take years to prove that a scientific breakthrough is safe and effective.

And telling a patient that we have new hope makes it all worth it.

With so many breakthroughs on the horizon, we've built a new research hub where our scientists can explore them. The AHN Cancer Institute at Allegheny General Hospital (AGH) in Pittsburgh is where we research theories, test clinical trials, and explore cutting-edge technology. All with the goal of detecting cancer earlier and treating it better while reducing the impact to patients' bodies and lives.

One nurse to guide each patient

Patients have their own nurse navigator from beginning to end of their cancer journey, for comprehensive guidance and support.

Testing genes for hereditary cancer

If a patient has a type of cancer that poses an inherited cancer risk, we have genetic counselors who provide testing and management options.

Rehabilitating the body

Specially trained AHN oncology physical therapists can help minimize side effects and maximize a patient's quality of life.

Keeping the heart strong

Patients who may be at risk for heart troubles because of their treatments can receive care from our cardio-oncology specialists.

Holistic approach to treatment

Patients can have complementary therapies like meditation, massage therapy, yoga, and acupuncture.

Strengthening mental health

We have psychiatrists, social workers, and support groups to help patients with their mental well-being.
